

**Sistemas Partidários e Políticas Públicas: Europa e América Latina em Perspectiva Comparada
(3 créditos)**

As democracias contemporâneas, segundo analistas e observadores da política, viveriam grave crise de legitimidade, advinda, sobretudo, pelo fato de que suas instituições centrais, notadamente os partidos políticos, não cumpririam as funções básicas de representar e canalizar demandas e preferências sociais relevantes, tendo em vista torná-las parte da agenda governamental de políticas públicas. Contudo, boa parte de tais diagnósticos não se assentam em modelos explicativos consistentes sobre o que são os partidos, como se comportam e os motivos pelos quais se comportam de determinada maneira. Nesse curso, propomos um exame mais cuidadoso das estratégias adotadas pelos partidos na Europa e na América Latina e a relação de tais estratégias com as políticas públicas defendidas e propostas pelas diferentes agremiações, quando no governo ou na oposição. Buscamos assim fornecer subsídios conceituais e empíricos mais sólidos para qualquer discussão envolvendo uma suposta situação de crise de legitimidade ou decadência das instituições partidárias.

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
